The goal was 8 meetings. 21 22 Feedback: The Wilton Facebook page brough up that some residents who use solar power was 23 upset that they were switched and about net metering. They tried to talk to everyone 24 individually. It was suggested to be on the plan in the winter and off the plan in the summer. 25 Flag on Eversource data is 80% right. 26 27 Ray Humphreys said he is interested in the outcome of the first survey question regarding 28 money vs green. Bob Hayden said that about 10% of the people say money. Eversource is 29 30 remiss they have the data out there. It is the unspecified to the system they use. Eversource needs some improvement in their computer systems. 31 32 Bob Hayden said people who have solar, are "my people" because I've been in solar for a long 33 time. He rebuilds old hydro plants. In his opinion, if someone spent money to build solar, we 34 35 want to counsel them. They are trying to network and talk to as many people as possible. 36 Liz Smith spoke regarding the Wilton post. She saw, "Who made the decision to switch me?" 37 38 She sympathized with them now after being involved here. Who are we to sever a contract? 39 The recent Eversource bill informed customers there will be rate increase. 40 41 Go over agreement to approve the community plan. 42 43 Last revision is July 31 and included Mike's corrections. Theresa fixed grammatic questions. Ray's questions were answered previous meeting. Geoff Brock said his questions were the 44 45 same as Ray's.

Will sweep the data every month and some of the contracts are indefinite and they could get lost. We can counsel them to terminate the other contract when entering the plan.
